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Enhancing Your CCLS Credential

It is common for CCLSs to wonder what other certifications are complementary to that of CCLS? Many child life specialists are interested in furthering their education, extending their skills to other avenues and finding other areas in the community that would benefit from the services of a CCLS.

ACLP encourages advancing your knowledge as a CCLS and offers PDUs for taking continuing education course work. You may also be fortunate to have a workplace that provides funding for continuing education.

Before you venture down the road of your time and finances, ask yourself the following questions:

- Do I already have these skills as a CCLS?
- Would I benefit from a refresher presentation?
- Should I meet with a mentor (ACLP offers this program and participation gains you PDUs)?
- Do I need this additional certification to safely, ethically and legally provide services to patients and families?

What is your ultimate goal? If you're thinking about larger growth, you may want to consider a master's degree or doctoral degree. A focus on an area such as child/human development, counseling, public health, or healthcare administration are connected easily to that of child life.

If you are in a newborn/infant unit and are interested in growing your specific practice, you may consider an IBCLC-International Board Certified Lactation Consultant or CEIM-Certified Educator of Infant Massage. These certifications can assist families in growing their connection to their infant and furthering patient and family-centered care.

Pursuing certification in complementary and alternative medicine techniques such as hypnotherapy, Reiki, or aroma therapy would deepen your practice in the realm of non-pharmacological interventions.

Depending on your level of education, you may want to build on your passion for therapy and play; consider pursuing becoming a RPT-Registered Play Therapist. Recently there was forum conversation regarding the pathway to becoming a Certified Grief Counsellor Child/Adolescent (GCCA-C) to deepen the practice in supporting children and adolescents experiencing loss.

Because Certified Child Life Specialists touch the lives of so many in a range of avenues, the list goes on and can be endless. Is it that you are wanting to further your education, do you need a new challenge or seek the desire for change? Reflect on your current skills and practice as a CCLS, ask questions of each other on ACLP Connect, and consider a mentor from the ACLP Mentorship program or through your place of employment. The ACLP is here to support our members; let us know what we can do for you next.

Classification of PDU's Relating to Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

Subject Matter for Recertification

The mission of the Child Life Certification Commission (CLCC) is to maintain a quality certification program for the child life profession. As the certifying body of ACLP, the CLCC recognizes racial discrimination as a key social determinant of health and driver of racial/ethnic health inequities. The American Academy of Pediatrics statement on the Impact of Racism on Child and Adolescent Health (2019) President Sally Goza, MD, FAAP, states "Racism harms children's health, starting from before they are born... a growing body of research supports this, and we cannot ignore the impact." According to the Child Life Code of Ethics, Certified Child Life Specialists have an obligation to maintain an environment that respects variations in culture, age, gender, race, ethnicity, physical ability, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, religious affiliation, veteran status, and socioeconomic status.

As CCLS, we recognize that diversity, equity, and inclusion have always been integral to the scope of practice of a CCLS. CCLSs utilize stress assessment and family variables that "focus on support systems and resources, family needs, language and cultural beliefs and values, life stressors, opportunities to understand and participate fully in their health care." (Thompson, 2018, pp. 50). Issues surrounding racism, diversity, equity, and inclusion are implicit throughout all domains of the exam content outline.

ACLP is currently offering many webinars and annual conference opportunities addressing DEI at both the introductory and advanced levels. As stated in the CLCC Recertification Manual, for an educational event to qualify as a Professional Development Unit (PDU), the content must relate to one of the three professional domains from the Exam Content Outline: 1) professional responsibility, 2) assessment, and 3) intervention.

CLCC recognizes that many CCLSs are following the ACLP DEI call to action and seeking continuing education and self-reflection opportunities related to DEI.

CLCC supports CCLSs in their quest to further their knowledge and understanding of how racism can impact the practice of and ability to care for children and families that they serve. Therefore, CLCC is accepting DEI PDUs in any of the 3 domains for recertification: Professional Responsibility, Assessment, and Intervention, provided that the PDU has met the necessary requirements for PDUs. At this time, CLCC has not placed a limit on the number of DEI PDUs that can be obtained by an individual applying for recertification.

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Emotional Safety Initiative

Have you heard about ACLP's Emotional Safety Initiative? This is a movement to prioritize emotional safety in pediatric care at the same level as physical safety. Certification Exam Administration

The Child Life Professional Certification Examination was administered in March with the following results:

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Certification Maintenance

CCLSs are required to pay a certification maintenance fee by January 31 of each of the first 4 years of each certification cycle. If unpaid as of April 1, certification becomes inactive. One hundred forty individuals currently have an inactive certification status due to non-payment of the 2021 certification maintenance fee. Existing annual maintenance fees are due by 12/31/2021 to avoid loss of the CCLS credential.

Reinstatement applications will be accepted through December 31, 2021.

Roughly 97% of CCLSs who owed this fee have made their payment.
