Did you know the Child Life Professional Certification Examination is developed by people like you? The examination begins with Certified Child Life Specialists creating questions as Item Writers. You could be one of these Item Writers! Item Writers are paired with an experienced coach who teaches the basics of writing exam questions. Through a five-month period, Item Writers usually develop five questions using the Exam Content Outline. If you are good at written communication, thinking outside the box, and working as a member of the team, serving as an Item Writer could be a perfect fit for you.

If you are considering volunteering, remember volunteering also comes with some benefits. Below is a summary, not all inclusive, of a few of the benefits of volunteering with CLCC.

- You earn PDUs- serving a year with CLCC is worth 1 PDU in Professional Responsibility
- Your child life team and students benefit from a person who has firsthand experience with the certification process and can act as a resource to help address questions about certification and recertification
- You experience the opportunity to network with professionals across the globe
- You engage in leadership development
- You contribute to the profession and influence the future of the profession

Making the Most of the ACLP Virtual Conference

The 2021 Child Life Annual Conference will be virtual. It is a great way to earn your certification PDUs. You can attend from any location and attend sessions according to your schedule. Here are some tips for attending virtual conferences:

- Create an environment for learning
 - Check your technology prior to conference. Make sure you have all the necessary capability (microphone, camera, sound, reliable internet access, etc.).
 - Find a quiet space free from distraction.
 - o Gather supplies to support your learning style. Have a notebook and pen for additional notes. Print any handouts that you want to reference during the session.
- Engage and network
 - Be an active participant in virtual discussions.
 - Discuss sessions that you attended with your peers.
 - Watch sessions with your peers who are also attending the conference.
 - Attend networking sessions.
- Recharge prior to your next session
- Have snacks and water available

 - Stand and stretch or talk a walk in between sessions.
 - Pace on-demand sessions that best fit your schedule. On-demand sessions will be available for a year.

Certification Maintenance

March 31, 2021 is the last day to pay the annual certification maintenance fee before certification becomes inactive. There are 260 CCLSs who still owe this fee for 2021. If unpaid on April 1st, their certification status will change to inactive, and they would need to reinstate the credential by paying an additional fee. <u>Reinstatement</u> applications will be accepted through December 31, 2021.

Roughly 95% of CCLSs who owed this fee have made their payment.
