Association of Child Life Professionals Statement Backing the American Academy of Pediatrics Policy Supporting Adolescents' Rights to Access Reproductive Healthcare Services

On behalf of The Association of Child Life Professionals Board of Directors

Despite the recent Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe v. Wade, the Association of Child Life Professionals (ACLP) remains resolute in backing the American Academy of Pediatrics' longstanding policy of supporting adolescents' right to access comprehensive, evidence-based reproductive healthcare services, including access to safe and legal pregnancy termination.

We are deeply concerned about the impact that this ruling, and the subsequent laws to follow that will force unwanted pregnancies, will have on children and adolescents' health, education, employment, and earning prospects, especially among those who are already marginalized, those living in poverty, people of color, and those who identify as nonbinary and transgender that are disproportionately affected by limited access to quality healthcare. These laws negatively impact the emotional safety of the patients and families we serve.

It is expected that child life specialists and aspiring professionals, who are addressing the emotional safety concerns of children and families in the aftermath of this ruling, may experience increased stress and hardship. ACLP is committed to developing and sharing appropriate resources for those in the child life community and supporting the advocacy efforts of the pediatric community.
